10 **A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PHYSICAL EDUCATION IN PUBLIC**
20 **HIGH SCHOOLS**

30 **WHEREAS:** “Maryland has adult obesity rates of 23.4 percent,” and is therefore ranked the
40 29th heaviest state in the country; and,

50 **WHEREAS:** It is a national goal to reduce the obesity rates in the country to 15 percent by
60 the year 2010; and,

70 **WHEREAS:** Nationally, 30.4 percent of adolescents aged 12-19 are overweight and 15
80 percent are obese; and,

90 **WHEREAS:** Pennsylvania already requires mandatory physical education at all grade levels,
100 with time requirements varying by grade level; and,

110 **WHEREAS:** New York public schools require 120 minutes of physical education each
120 semester; and,

130 **WHEREAS:** It is a largely accepted fact that athletics promote such vital social skills as
140 teamwork and sportsmanship in adolescents.

150 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Maryland Student Legislature urges the
160 Maryland General Assembly to pass legislation requiring all students in
170 public high schools in Maryland to take a physical education class each semester
180 for three years; and,

190 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** That each student should be required to take the same general
200 physical education course their freshman year of high school, and shall then be
210 offered a number of choices of physical education classes to choose from after
220 their freshman year; and,

230 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** It shall be up to the discretion of each county in Maryland how
240 new physical education classes will be worked into their credit system; and,

250 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the Maryland Student Legislature urges the Governor to
260 sign such legislation.
